Sacred Heart Primary School Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure Report to Parents: 2015-16. (Showing impact)



What is the Pupil Premium Grant? The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) is funding, allocated from the Government, to support the narrowing of the attainment gap between disadvantaged pupils and all other pupils. Disadvantaged pupils are defined as children from 1 of three groups. These are Children of service families, children looked after and children who are in receipt of Free School Meals (FSM) or have been in receipt of Free School Meals in the last 6 years.

This document aims to:

- Outline the amount of PPG funding that the school has received to support Pupils this academic year.
- Outline how that money has or will be spent to support learning of disadvantaged pupils.
- Illustrate the impact of the PPG funding on the progress of disadvantaged pupils in the school.

Closing the Gap between PP and Non FSM

Key Stage 2 2014-15 (6 pupils in Y6 cohort with pupil premium = 17 %.)

Reading: All pupils gained L4 or above. All children made at least expected progress (2 levels) and 2 pupils made 3 levels progress. There is no in-school gap.

<u>Writing</u>: All pupils gained L4 or above. All children made at least expected progress (2 levels) and 1 pupil 3 levels progress. There is no in-school gap.

Maths: 5/6 pupils gained L4 or above. 5 pupils made at least expected progress (2 levels) 1 pupil 3 levels. There is a 6% in-school gap which represents less than one pupil.

EGPS (grammar, punctuation and spelling): All pupils gained L4 or above which shows there is no in-school gap.

Key Stage 1 2014 -15

For Year 2 cohort (5 pupils with Pupil Premium = 16%)

Reading: All pupils gained L2B or above and 3/5 pupils made more than 3 sub levels Progress. **There is no in-school gap.**

Writing: 4/5 pupils gained L2B+, 4/5 pupils made more than 3 sub levels Progress. There is an 8% in-school gap which represents less than one pupil.

Maths: 4/5 pupils gained L2B+ and 3/5 pupils made more than 3 sub levels Progress. There is an 8% in-school gap which represents less than one pupil.

In all subjects for both KS1 and KS2 the in-school gap is less than the national gap.

Actions:

- Staff training: QFT (Quality First Teaching) Grammar, spelling and punctuation.
- Follow up lesson observations by Headteacher and SLT to increase the % of outstanding lessons.
- Raise standards in grammar for writing.
- Raise standards in maths. Use of Numicon to support children's understanding in maths, especially in relation to number and calculation.

 The following table details services purchased with PPG monies and the impact of these services on attainment and progress of disadvantaged pupils.
